Prosecutor, Chiefs to Conduct Anti-Theft Training for Community Organizations

Warren County has been exposed to several cases involving misappropriation of funds collected for the benefit of non-profit, church, school, charitable, or other community organizations. The most recent case involves felony charges against the former director of the Lebanon Area Chamber of Commerce. The unfortunate consequence of these cases is that thousands of dollars raised by community organizations are not being used for their intended purpose.

As a result, Warren County Prosecutor David P. Fornshell and the Warren County Police Chiefs Association are again co-sponsoring a community training that provides information concerning money handling systems, anti-theft procedures, and internal controls for the benefit of community organizations. The training is designed for board members, officials, directors, and volunteers associated with non-profit, church, school, charitable, or other community organizations. The most recent training presented by Prosecutor Fornshell and the Chiefs Association attracted over 75 attendees.

The training will be held on Monday, September 14, 2015, from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the Multipurpose Room of the Warren County Prosecutor's Office, 520 Justice Drive, Lebanon, Ohio. The training is presented as a public service and is free and open to the public.
