

Former Springboro High School Student Admits to Bringing Hashish Brownies to School

Edward Goschinski, 19, of Springboro pled guilty today before Warren County Common Pleas Judge Robert Peeler to one count of possession of hashish, a felony of the 5th degree, and three counts of contributing to the delinquency of a minor, misdemeanors of the 1st degree.

On April 10, 2015, Goschinski, a senior at the time, brought hashish brownies to Springboro High School and supplied them to three students. Additionally, he provided one to a teacher who did not know the nature of the item. Later in the day, another student overheard Goschinski and others discussing giving a pot brownie to a teacher and informed the teacher. One brownie was recovered containing 43.62 grams of hashish. School officials reviewed security video showing Goschinski repeatedly meeting with students at his locker during the day and giving them something to eat. Hashish is made from marijuana and contains a high level of the chemical THC.

Warren County Prosecutor David P. Fornshell commended the efforts of Detective Nathan Anderkin of the Springboro Police Department and Assistant Prosecutor Travis Vieux.
