

Over the years, Warren County has been exposed to several cases involving misappropriation of funds collected for the benefit of non-profit, church, school, charitable, or other community organizations. These have included internal thefts against a local chamber of commerce, boosters, and other sports organizations. The unfortunate consequence of these cases is that thousands of dollars raised by community organizations are not being used for their intended purpose.

As a result, Warren County Prosecutor David P. Fornshell and the Warren County Police Chiefs Association are again co-sponsoring a community training that provides information concerning money handling systems, anti-theft procedures, and internal controls for the benefit of community organizations. The training is designed for board members, officials, directors, and volunteers associated with non-profit, church, school, charitable, or other community organizations. The most recent training presented by Prosecutor Fornshell and the Chiefs Association attracted over 50 attendees.

The training will be held on Wednesday, October 24, 2018 from 7:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. in the Multipurpose Room of the Warren County Prosecutor's Office, 520 Justice Drive, Lebanon, Ohio. Attendees will need to enter through 500 Justice Drive (Common Pleas Court Building). The training is presented as a public service and is free and open to the public.
