CONSEQUENCES

If your child is unruly, he or she can be:

- Held in the Juvenile Detention Center for no more than 24 hours
- Ordered to complete community service
- Ordered to complete the Seizing Opportunities Achieving Results (S.O.A.R.) program
- Ordered to comply with the Coordinated Care Team
- Removed from their home and placed into a foster home
- Ordered to engage in counseling

THE LAW

All children must obey their parents and teachers.



An Unruly Child is:

- Any child who does not submit to the reasonable control of the child's parents, teachers, guardian, or custodian, by reason of being wayward or habitually disobedient
- Any child who behaves in a manner that injures or endangers the child's own health or morals or the health or morals of others
- Any child who is habitually truant from school
- Any child who violates a law that applies only to minors

EXAMPLES OF UNRULY BEHAVIOR

Habitually missing school

Disobeying household rules

Running away from home

Using tobacco products

Violating curfew



FILING CHARGES



- If it is an emergency, contact your local police department.
- If your child is truant, go to the Prosecutor's Office on Tuesday or Thursday between 1 and 4 p.m.
- If your child is a runaway, go to the Prosecutor's Office any day between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.
