Burglar Sentenced to Prison

Jessica Coffey, a 26-year-old woman, was sentenced Wednesday to serve 10 years in prison for committing a rash of burglaries in Turtlecreek and Clearcreek Townships.

Coffey pled guilty in June to seven felony burglary charges and two gun specifications. Warren County Common Pleas Court Judge Neal Bronson sentenced Coffey to serve five years in prison (concurrent) on three of the burglaries, three years in prison (concurrent) on the other four burglaries, and one year in prison (consecutive) on the two gun specifications, for a total of ten years. Coffey was also ordered to pay restitution of \$33,452.31 to the seven victims.

Coffey broke into seven homes in February and March earlier this year and stole various items, including firearms, televisions and a large amount of jewelry. The crimes were motivated by an effort to finance an illegal drug habit. Assistant Prosecutor Derek Faulkner prosecuted the case, which was investigated by officers from Clearcreek Township and the Warren County Sheriff's Office.

The case against co-Defendant Courtney Ralston is scheduled for trial in August.
