Man Sentenced for Involuntary Manslaughter and Corrupting Another with Drugs

Austin Wells, 26, was sentenced to 10 years in prison today by Warren County Common Pleas Judge Donald Oda.

In December 2015, the Warren County Prosecutor's Office obtained its first ever conviction for involuntary manslaughter against a defendant who furnished illegal drugs to a local man that died of a drug overdose. On January 20, 2015, Wells provided what he believed was heroin to Ryan Patrick. Mr. Patrick injected the drug and immediately overdosed. Toxicology reports later confirmed that Mr. Patrick died of a multi-drug intoxication of fentanyl and cocaine. The jury unanimously convicted Wells of involuntary manslaughter and corrupting another with drugs.

"Today's sentence does not bring back Mr. Patrick, but it does send a message to anyone who would consider dealing drugs in Warren County that they will be held responsible for the damage caused by the poison they are sending out into our community," said Warren County Prosecutor David P. Fornshell.
