



Dayton Man Sentenced for Series of Aggravated Robberies

Warren County Prosecutor David P. Fornshell announced that Da'Sean McCleskey, 22, of Dayton, Ohio, was sentenced today to 9 to 10 ½ years in prison by Warren County Common Pleas Court Judge Robert Peeler. In August, McCleskey pled guilty as charged to seven counts of aggravated robbery with a firearm, all felonies of the first degree.

From December 21, 2021 through January 19, 2022, McCleskey engaged in a series of seven aggravated robberies of gas stations in the cities of Franklin, Moraine, Huber Heights, Beavercreek, and Riverside. McCleskey entered each gas station, masked and armed, and held the gas station clerk at gunpoint while demanding money. Prior to committing these aggravated robberies, McCleskey was a delivery driver for Home City Ice. Each of his targeted businesses were customers to which he delivered.

Flock safety cameras were instrumental in identifying McCleskey's personal vehicle used in the commission of these crimes. Even though defendant attempted to hide his identity by removing his license plate, the license plate reader camera technology allowed police to identify the make and model of the car used. With that information, police ultimately matched the vehicle to McCleskey.

Fornshell commended Detective David Hatfield of the Franklin Police Department, Detective Nathan Curley of the Dayton Police Department, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Kevin Hardman, Victim Witness Coordinator Erika Bourelle, and Legal Assistant Brenda Berry for their work on the case.
