

Jury Convicts Man of Violating a Protection Order via Text Messages

Jacob Plummer, 32, of West Carrollton was convicted by a Warren County jury today of violation of protection order, a felony of the fifth degree. Plummer has a prior conviction for the same offense, making this a felony.

On February 3, 2015, the Warren County Domestic Relations Court granted a civil protection order ordering that Plummer have no contact with the victim. Plummer was served with the order on February 9. The order states Plummer cannot contact the victim by any means, including text messages. On the following two days, February 10 and 11, Plummer sent the victim several text messages. The victim then reported the contact to the City of Franklin Police Department.

Warren County Common Pleas Court Judge Michael Gilb revoked Plummer's bond, and he will be sentenced at a later date following a presentence investigation.

Warren County Prosecutor David P. Fornshell commended the efforts of Officer Amanda Myers of the Franklin Police Department, Assistant Prosecutor Derek Faulkner, Director of Victim Witness Services Jessi Flint, and Legal Assistant Brenda Berry for the successful investigation and prosecution of this case.
